www.Accent On Music.com. It is in the key of C, using mostly block chords with the moving melody line connecting the plucked chords. To play the chords written here, you will need to pluck with the thumb and three fingers of your picking hand. If you don't pick with your ring finger, learn to! If you need to leave out one of the four notes, some understanding of music theory (or a good ear!) is necessary to help you determine which note you may leave out without affecting the chord's function. Watch the C/G (ring finger reaches out to the sixth string), and G7 (little finger frets the fourth string) in measures 5-6 This is written in "cut" time, meaning to count half notes as the main pulse. - Mark Hanson
